



Sastanak radne skupine za zatajivanje srca Hrvatskog kardiološkog društva Split, 15. ožujka 2008. godine

Meeting of the Task Force Group for Heart Failure of the Croatian Cardiac Society Split, 15th March 2008

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Registar za zatajivanje srca za bolničke bolesnike počeo se ispunjavati 1. listopada 2005. godine. Budući da je tijekom godine i pol iskustva s ispunjanjem podataka, uočeno nekoliko informatičkih problema, Registar je, krajem 2006. godine, "dotjeran" i sada značajno bolje "funkcionira". Nova varijanta Registra obuhvaća "stare" i "nove" podatke. Naime, bilo je potrebno uz nove bolesnike "prenijeti" i podatke upisane prethodnim informatičkim sustavom.

Na sastanku dogovoreno je da će se bolesnici, uvedeni u Registar, pratiti i dalje nakon godine dana, u jednogodišnjim intervalima.

U pomaganju prikupljanja podataka, kolegama iz Kliničkog bolničkog centra Split, priključili su se liječnici Zaveda za javno zdravstvo Splitsko-dalmatinske županije, koji pored podataka o zatajivanju srca prikupljaju i podatke o akutnom koronarnom sindromu. Kolegice epidemiologinje bitno su ubrzale našu zadaću ispunjanja podataka u Registar o zatajivanju srca. Riječ je o boljem "funkcioniranju" Registra u Splitu, jer je posao došao u "ruke" osobama koje su za to najbolje kvalificirane. Slična se suradnja (epidemiologa i kardiologa) nudi i drugim centrima gdje takva služba (epidemiološka) postoji (Rijeka, Osijek, npr.).

Predloženo je poboljšanje informatičke obrade podataka, kako bi bili što dostupniji članovima Hrvatskog kardiološkog društva i suradnicima koji ga ispunjavaju. Drugim riječima, informatička služba koja trenutno daje potporu Registru, treba (što hitnije) omogućiti uporabu vlastitih podataka o bolesnicima kojeg su ispunili pojedini centri, što do sada nije bio slučaj.

Također je predloženo sponzoru Registra, farmaceutskoj tvrtci Merck-Serono, kojeg je predstavljala dr. Elizabet Balojević, da se čim prije pronade osoba koja će, statistički obrađivati podatke, prema potrebama pojedinih centara.

Objava novih rezultata iz Registra očekuje se na sljedećem nacionalnom kardiološkom kongresu koji će se održati u jesen ove godine.



The Register for Heart Failure amongst hospitalized patients began on 1st October 2005. Since experience has been gained on the basis of one and a half years of completed data, some IT issues have arisen. The Register was at the end of 2006 improved and now "functions" considerably better. The new variant of the Register encompasses "old" and "new" data. Actually, it was necessary along with the new patients to "transfer" even the data entered by the previous IT system.

At the meeting it was agreed that the patients entered into the Register would be monitored and further following a year, in yearly intervals.

In assisting the process of gathering of data, the colleagues from the Clinical Hospital Centre Split were joined by the physician from the Public Health Bureau of the Split-Dalmatia County, who besides data on heart failure also gathered data on acute coronary syndrome. Colleagues, epidemiologists considerably sped up our task of completing the data in the Register on heart failure. The result was better "functioning" of the Register in Split, since the job was undertaken by persons who were best qualified for such a task. Similar cooperation (between epidemiologists and cardiologists) is offered to other centers where such a service (epidemiology) exists (Rijeka, Osijek, etc.).

We recommend improving the IT data analysis as to make them more readily available to the members of the Croatian Cardiac Society and co-workers who update such information. In other words, the IT service currently offering support for the Register, should urgently allow use of its own data regarding patients filled out by individuals at the centre, which has not been the case up to now.

Also, it has been recommended to the sponsor for the Register, the pharmaceutical company Merck-Serono, represented by Elizabeth Balojević, M.D., that a person should be selected as soon as possible who would perform a statistical analysis of the data based on requirements of the particular centers.

Publishing of the recent results from the Register is expected at the next national cardiac congress which is to be held in the autumn of this year.

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
